Brief Program Overview

Discover a world of education

The International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) is a recognized leader in the field of international education, encouraging students to be active learners, well-rounded individuals and engaged world citizens. Founded in 1968, there are currently 1,722 schools in 122 countries that offer one of the three challenging IB programs to more than 200,000 students aged 3 to 19 years.

What is so special about IB programs?

IB programs are recognized around the world and ensure an increased adaptability and mobility for IB students.

The curriculum and pedagogy of IB programs focus on international perspectives of learning and teaching, while insisting that students fully explore their home culture and language.

IB World Schools must undergo an exhaustive authorization process in order to offer one or more of the programs, which includes a study of the school's resources and commitment to the IBO mission and philosophy.

IB teachers participate in a wide variety of professional development opportunities to constantly update their knowledge and share their expertise with colleagues around the world.

Many students graduating from the Diploma Program find that it enhances their opportunities at tertiary institutions. The IBO works closely with universities around the world to gain recognition for IB programs.

The core components of IB programs encourage students to participate in creative and service-oriented activities, while at the same time emphasizing the importance of reflection on a personal and academic level.
